Qualifications:

Doctoral degree required; at least one advanced degree (doctoral or master's) must be in health services, public health, or a related discipline. Expertise in history and future of health services; health administration; organizational development; quality assurance; health policy and advocacy; health care reform; managed care, and health economics. Ability to teach lower division courses in core health topics as required (i.e. personal health, global health), research methods, and writing. Experience with a variety of instructional methodologies, selected from lecture, seminar, service-learning, accelerated courses, distance learning, online instruction, and hybrid modes. Demonstrated ability in grantsmanship, research, scholarly presentations and publications, and professional leadership. Applicants should have awareness of and sensitivity to the educational goals of a multicultural population as might have been gained in cross-cultural study, training, teaching, and other comparable experience.

Responsibilities:

Graduate and undergraduate courses relating to health services, other Health Science courses as required. Oversight responsibility for the Health Services Administration concentration of the Health Science major, including advising, outreach, recruitment, and support for student leadership. Development of online and hybrid courses and curriculum components. Coordination with Health Science Fieldwork Coordinator for quality assurance of health services sites, preceptors, and student performance. Outreach, recruitment, and coordination of health services and health administration fieldwork sites and preceptors for both undergraduate and graduate students. Assessment of student learning outcomes in the Health Services Administration concentration, as well as participation in ongoing assessment of the undergraduate and MPH program. Oversight responsibility for the health services and health administration curricular areas required for CEPH accreditation, including ongoing assessment and coordination with MPH Core faculty. Student advising, participation in university, college, and department outreach activities; support for workforce continuing education activities, participation in department events such as Welcome Convocation, Department Reunions, Graduation Convocation and Commencement ceremonies. Service on department, college, and university committees. Development and implementation of a research agenda, regular scholarly presentations and publications, and leadership in appropriate professional associations. Candidate must address the needs of a student population of great diversity – in age, cultural background, ethnicity, primary language, and academic preparation – through course materials, teaching strategies, and advisement.
